

Pupils sit SATs (Standard Assessment Tests) at the end of Years 2 and 6. The tests are used to track children's progress and compare their attainment with other children across the UK.

New-style SATs were introduced in summer 2016, reflecting the recent changes to the National Curriculum. The previous National Curriculum levels have been replaced by scaled scores, ranging from 80 to 120. Children with a scaled score of 100 or more are deemed to have achieved the *expected standard* set by the Department for Education.

Test results

The table shows the percentage of Phil & Jim children who achieved the national expected standard in the three disciplines tested: Reading, Maths and SPaG (Spelling, Punctuation And Grammar), and the percentage of children achieving a scaled score of 110 or more, which is identified nationally as a 'high score'.
